

- Grooming
 - Looking for something better:
 - Escape from current situation
 - Love
 - Someone who cares
 - Fame
 - Money





Chats From Trafficker to Victim

- "do you know how to cook if so would you be willing to be paid to cook for someone? please let me know and do you like black guy's"
- "are you willing to make \$2,800 in cash let me know and yes it's real I do it every week"
- "would you ever suck for money"






Chats From Victim to Trafficker

- "I'm willing to go all the way in any way"
- "I'm bringing clothes but I don't have much to wear"
- "they pretty much don't even know I exist. I'm like a ghost"
- "I'm not going to change my mind"
- "Omygod hotels are like a park for me"







Indicators of Trafficking

- Over controlling "boyfriend"
- Tattoo
- Poor hygiene
- Signs of physical abuse
- Drug abuse
- Health issues (STD/STI)
- Multiple mobile phones

Mobile Phones

- Identify and recruit victims
- Take pictures and videos
- Control victims
- Post ads
- Make appointments







Victim Control Through Technology

- Mobile phone GPS
- Constant texting
- Text message review
- Sexting
- Blackmail





Facebook & Social Media

- Target rich environment
- Easy to make "friends"
- Easy to identify "at-risk" youth
- Grooming process







Compliant or Controlled Victim

- Fear
- Difficult situation/life
- Previous contact with law enforcement
- Shame or self-blame
- Difficult
- Deceitful
- Loyalty toward trafficker














Victim-Centered Investigations

- Safe Harbor Laws
- Responsibility to rescue and aid victims
 - Investigator & Prosecutor needs victim assistance
- Victim needs:
 - Safety
 - Physical needs met
 - Emotional needs met





Responding to Victims

- Build TRUST
- Avoid judging them
- Accept their resistance
- Understand their changing stories
- Assess their level of safety





A Few Questions to Ask Victims

- How did you get here?
- Where do you live eat sleep?
- Do you control your own money / ID?
- Have you been physically harmed?
- Has anyone taken pictures/videos of you?
- Have you/your family been threatened?





Recovery Methods & Victim Needs

- Who can provide these needs?
 - Safe housing
 - Medical services
 - Clothing
 - Food
 - Emotional support
 - Personal and family safety
